The Executive Secretary also played host to the Governor of Delta State, Ifeanyi Okowa, who came with a plethora of requests for funding assistance for the three National Universities Commission (NUC) newly approved public tertiary institutions for the state.

It was also time to reflect on issue of service delivery with beneficiary institutions, as TETFund SERVICOM Unit organized a workshop on "Building skills for Effective Service Delivery for Nodal Officers and Directors of Quality Assurance in the 226 Public Tertiary Institutions across Nigeria.

The city of Abuja became agog, as Da'adhn Suleiman Bogoro, the son of Professor Bogoro walked down the isle with his heart throb, miss Abigail Jantua David Malgwi, in an epoch-making wedding ceremony, which attracted the who-is-who to the colourful occasion.

This edition saw the harvest awards for the man of the people, both at the grassroots, the media and women group, who recognizes the enormous contributions he had made and continues to make in the country. He was coronated as JenndemZa'ar, Abuja by GUNGZAAR ABUJA Council in recognition of his landmark achievements as the Executive Secretary of TETFund and service to humanity. They came in quick successions as the National Council for Women Societies (NCWS) presented him with an Award of Excellence and NCWS Goodwill Ambassador of Nigerian Women for his notable transparency and accountability in office. PROF. BOGORO COMMENDS FIRS FOR INCREASED TAX REMITTANCE

he Executive Secretary of Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund), Prof. Suleiman Elias Bogoro has commended the Management of Federal Inland Revenue Services (FIRS) over increased remittance of Education Tax to the Fund.

The Executive Secretary gave the commendation when he led the Management of the Fund on a courtesy visit to the Executive Chairman of FIRS, Muhammad Mamman Nami at the FIRS Headquarters in Abuja recently.

Prof. Bogoro disclosed that

the Board of Trustees and Management of TETFund are excited over the performance of FIRS, hence the decision to pay the visit and formally express the Fund's appreciation.

"It is good to acknowledge the goose that lays the golden egg as we are very comfortable in this house. Each time we meet in FIRS this is what we tell ourselves. This is because we witnessed the highest jump in the collection of the FIRS collection of two per cent of Education tax fund.

"We are veritable partners in executing our mandate of

applying the two per cent Education Tax which came to be in 1993 but the funds were applied in 1999 to 2010 under Education Trust Fund (ETF).

"In 2011, it was refocused to the original concept of TETFund replacing ETF and the focus was very direct; and that is for public tertiary institutions specifically, federal and state universities, polytechnics and colleges of education," he said.

"We always have a number of interactive fora. For instance, we have a TETFund/FIRS Joint



Interactive Forum annually and through it, we have the privilege of having a report from FIRS and we also show them precisely what we have been doing with the money.

"We also have Taxpayers Forum where we have an opportunity to appreciate those that pay the tax that the FIRS collect and remit to us and of course we also have Annual Tax Reconciliation exercise which is about to commence.

"We are aware that the Federal Ministry of Education had already proposed that the tax should be raised from two to three per cent and the process, of course, was led by the Federal Ministry of Education and not by TETFund. We sought the cooperation of the FIRS and they have always assured us, precisely since the arrival of the present Chairman, he did

promise that there will be a difference and we have seen a difference; and we said it is right to come and appreciate him and we are looking forward to exploring more avenues of increasing more collections of taxes.

"We have ensured in TETFund that we are responsible in applying the two per cent, the money you collect with sense of responsibility and that is why we can say without fear of contradiction that Nigerians acknowledged what we are doing with the money you collect with the sense of responsibility that the impact is manifested.

"We are determined to sustain and enhance performance in applying that money you collect and send to us. For the first time, the University of Ibadan was ranked among the best 500 universities in the world and each time we met, the Vice-Chancellor did confess that it wouldn't have been made possible without the intervention of TETFund," he added.

In his response, the Executive C hairman of FIRS acknowledged the commendation and stated that TETFund's appreciation was a call to do more for the country, assuring that they would do so.

He stated that the FIRS achieved the feat because of the commitment of taxpayers who in fact deserve the glory, the collaboration they have had with agencies of government such as TETFund in ensuring timely remittance of taxes and aggressive tax audit embarked upon by his colleagues.

PROF. BOGORO ADVOCATES KNOWLEDGE-BASED ECONOMY IN NIGERIA

he Executive Secretary of Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund), Prof Suleiman Elias Bogoro has advocated the need for Nigeria to move away from a resource to knowledge-based economy.

The Executive Secretary stated this while delivering a convocation lecture titled Forging Partnerships in the Triple Helix Model and the Drive for the Institutionalization of Nigeria's Knowledge Economyat the 9th Convocation Ceremony of Veritas University, Abuja, recently.

Prof. Bogoro stated that despite Nigeria's place as Africa's leading economy with a Gross Domestic Product (GDP)projected to grow between 1.7 and 2.0 per cent in 2021, the GDP would be of no effect if it did not translate into solving the problems of its citizens.

According to him, the country must engage in problem-solving research and build a knowledge-based economy to ensure global competitiveness.

He explained that; "The obvious reality is that nations



across the world are closing borders due to the Covid-19 pandemic with underlining economic reasons. We must fix Nigeria by adding value to our natural resources for global competitiveness and sustainable knowledge economy," he said.

Prof. Bogoro expressed worry that since after independence, Nigerian universities have been emphasizing teaching at the expense of research. He added that most of the research carried out in universities was for the purpose of acquiring degrees and not solving the nation's socio-economic problems.

According to him, part of the

problem is because there has not been adequate commitment of funds into Research and Development in the country and that partly accounts for the failure of research in the country.

The Executive Secretary stated that despite the periodic increase of TETFund's National Research Fund (NRF) grant from N5 billion to N8.5 billion in 2021, the funds were still grossly inadequate.

He added the Fund has been making a case for the establishment of a National Research and Development Foundation in the country, which when operational, would source for over \$2 billion as seed money to be

injected into research in the country.

Also speaking at the event, the Chancellor of the university, Rev. Dr. Ignatius Kaigama stressed the quality education offered by the university and expressed commitment that the institution would continue to train students and equip them to develop selfconfidence and become employers of labour.

In his convocation address, the Vice-Chancellor of the university, Prof. Hyacinth Ichoku disclosed that over the years, the institution has laboured to equip the students morally and academically to prepare them for the future.

He added that despite the challenges of the Covid-19 pandemic, the university utilized ICT to keep pace with its academic calendar during the lockdown and in keeping with Covid-19 protocols.

TETFund BEGINS RESEARCH FUNDING FOR DEFENCE AND SECURITY



he Tertiary Education
Trust Fund (TETFund)
has commenced

Military sub-sector.

Executive Secretary of TETFund, Professor Suleiman Elias Bogoromade this known at the beginning of a four-day meeting of the Fund's Research and Development

Standing Committee (RDSC) held in Abuja recently.

The Executive Secretary explained that the move by TETFund would ensure that the Nigerian Armed Forces have the capacity to produce weapons and other equipment that can be deployed in the fight against terrorism and other security challenges in the country.

Prof. Bogoro added that the Fund's efforts in deepening R&D in the country has also yielded results in supporting researchers to develop vaccines and other products required in combating the Covid-19 Virus.

"Mr. President last year told the Hon. Minister of Education, Mallam Adamu Adamu, to instruct TETFund



to support the Federal Government initiatives of responding to the COVID-19 threat through ground-breaking research for Phytome dical drugs, prophylactics, PPE and eventually vaccines.

"I am pleased to inform you that TETFund has gone far in i m p I e m e n t i n g t h e President's directives and soon the results will be announced.

"Similarly, TETFund has also commenced funding of Defence and Security R&D towards responding to the unfortunate insecurity challenges and insurgency in the country, towards making Nigeria self-sufficient in locally produced technology for our Armed Forces and other security agencies," he said.

The Executive Secretary expressed delight over the performance of RDSC and stated that the various reports submitted by the committee indicated that the Triple Helix model, which brings Government, Academia and Industry on the same platform holds the key to a brighter future for Nigeria.

He added that the purpose of the meeting was to validate and adopt reports from the 13 Thematic Groups and to also verify and endorse the National R&D Foundation (NRDF) Establishment Framework.

Prof. Bogoro paid glowing tributes to four members of the Committee who passed away in recent months, assuring the families that they would not be forgotten because they died in service to the Nation. The deceased members are Prof. Emmanuel Ezugwu, Prof. Femi Odekunle, Prof. Habu Galadima and Prof. Ibidapo-Obe.

Also making his remarks at the meeting, the Chairman of RDSC, Emeritus Professor Njidda Gadzama said the body was able to come up with an action plan that would see the establishment of the National R & D Foundation.

He stated that the visits of the 13 thematic groups to various strategic institutions across the country revealed that Nigeria has what it takes to compete favourably with other countries in the area of innovation and scientific development.

GOV. OKOWA SEEKS FUNDING SUPPORT FOR NEWLY UPGRADED UNIVERSITIES

elta State Governor, Dr. Ifeanyi Arthur Okowa has called on the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) to provide funding assistance to three institutions recently upgraded to the status of universities in the state.

The Governor made this appeal during a courtesy visit to the Executive Secretary of TETFund, Prof. Suleiman Elias Bogoro at the Fund's Headquarters recently.

Speaking at the meeting, Governor Okowa lauded the contributions of TETFund to higher education development in the country, stating that the Fund has hadfar-reaching impact on education in the country and Delta State was no exception.

The Governor cited Delta State University, Abraka as a prime example of TETFund's transformative intervention in public tertiary institutions in the state; with the university boasting of state-of-the art facilities, particularly its Ultra-Modern Mega Library Complex funded by TETFund.

Dr. Okowa explained that the primary reason for upgrading some of the institutions to universities was due to the inability of Delta State University, Abraka to cater for the vast volume of eligible applicants seeking university admission in the state.

The newly upgraded universities are Delta State University of Education, Agbor, formerly College of Education Agbor; Delta State University of Science and Agriculture, Anwai, formerly Delta State University, Anwai Campus

and Delta State University of Science and Education, Ozoro, formerly Delta State Polytechnic Ozoro.

In his response, Prof. Suleiman Elias Bogoro expressed his admiration for the strong commitment the Governor had shown towards providing quality education in his state.

He stated that the Fund would support the state in line with the mandate of the Fund and approvals of the Board of Trustees of TETFund.

He explained that according to the Fund's guidelines, a state is permitted to enlist only two institutions of the same type owned by it; and annual funding for the institutions are alternated. Hence, where a state has more than two institutions of the same type, only two can be enlisted with the Fund at a particular time.

He, therefore, advised that on completion of the accreditation process for the new universities, the state should provide necessary documents and follow due process in accessing intervention funds for the two institutions that would be selected for enlistment by TETFund.

Present at the meeting, was the Executive Secretary of National Universities Commission (NUC), Prof. Abubakar Rasheed, Deputy Executive Secretary of NUC,Mr. Christopher Jibreel Maiyaki, top government functionaries of the state, management staff of TETFund, among others.

He urged the representatives of the institutions to inculcate efficient service delivery to ensure Nigerian higher institutions compete favourably with the best in the world.



BOGORO RECEIVES AWARD OF PATRIOTISM

he National Council for Women Societies (NCWS) has bestowed on the Executive Secretary of Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund), Professor Suleiman Elias Bogoro a meritorious award for 'Exemplary Patriotic Services to Nigeria'.

The award was presented to him by the National President of the Association, Dr Gloria Laraba Shoda at a ceremony which took place at the Fund's Headquarters, in Abuja, recently.

In her keynote address, Dr Shoda expressed immense appreciation for the impact of TETFund interventions in the Tertiary Education Sector under the leadership of Professor Bogoro. She declared TETFund a vital agency to National Development and predicted greater achievements for the Fund in years to come.

She stated: "It is not unusual to visit a campus of public tertiary institution and see a row of TETFund buildings constructed to fill in infrastructural gaps in the particular. This bridges any shortfalls and ensures our in stitutions can accommodate the thousands of students, as well as to meet up with International standards".

Dr Shoda further appreciated Professor Bogoro for being a renowned researcher and for bringing such expertise to bear in the mandate of TETFund by spearheading the creation of the Department of Research and Development.

According to her, "it means that apart from physical infrastructure, TETFund is also interested in exploring new ways by which our educational institutions can thrive in this 21st Century".

Responding, the Executive Secretary commended the group for their determination to better the prospects of women, expressing his



appreciation for the efforts and contributions of women in both the academic and non-academic sectors of the society.

"I was at the last convocation of the Veritas University, and there is a consistent trend for nearly 2-3 decades at University Convocations, whereby the women have overtaken the men in terms of competitiveness, as the first-class graduates were nearly 80% women"

Professor Bogoro however lamented the fact that many State Governments were yet to ratify several international instruments aimed at granting rights to women and children.

"For some of us from the Northern part of the country, we know that we are grappling with the disturbing tendency of making the women folk at greater disadvantage than the men. That cannot continue for too

long because to neglect the role of women is to neglect a segment that is at the least half the population of the community".

The Executive Secretary reiterated his commitment to observing gender equality within TETFund and all its activities. "When we constituted the TETFund Research and Development Standing Committee, we had about two women that are chairing, or even up to three. We have the current President of the Nigerian Academy of Science, Professor Braide Ekanem. She is chairing one of our Sub-committees. We have Professor Hadiza Galadanchi a professor of Medicine from the Bayero University Kano, and of course we have Professor Lami Lombin, she is deputising in the Health Committee, we have Professor Mrs Gambo Laraba, she is either chairing or deputy chair of one of the

sub-committees, and of course she happens to be a Professor of Chemistry. She taught meas an undergraduate".

"We can go on and on, but there are no excuses to relegate women whether from our homes, in public spaces, in private, or overall, in the society for any reason. So, when women decide to pass a verdict as they have done here today in TETFund, we just want to say thank you very much" he concluded.

While singing and celebrating, the NCWS team decorated Professor Bogoro as a Goodwill Ambassador of Nigerian Women and presented him with a life membership medal in recognition of his transparency, accountability, and infrastructural and capacity development of tertiary institutions.
